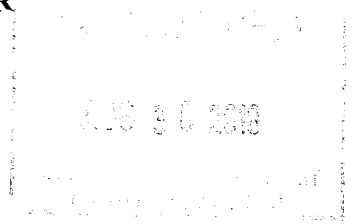

ORDER



This matter having come before the Court by motions filed by the above-named Plaintiff, Carrie M. Leo, pro se, supported by affidavits of Carrie M. 
And the matter having duly come on to be heard before this Court;

NOW, upon due consideration of the facts and circumstances presented on this motion upon oral argument and upon the filed documents, and upon due deliberation by the Court; it is hereby

ORDERED that the Defendant, Tyler C. Thomas, shall return the "badger" now in his possession to the possession of the Plaintiff, Carrie M. Leo, on or before August 27, 2018; and it is further

ORDERED, that the Plaintiff is shall be allowed to redact from her Court filings any and all "Confidential Personal Information" as defined in and limited by 22 N.Y.C.R.R. 202[e][1], and to thereafter resubmit her Court filings.
